## Ways to Support the Campaign Against Political Correctness

You can support the Campaign Against Political Correctness in a number of ways – either formally or informally. Anything you can do to make a stand against political correctness will make a difference and together we can prevent the spread of this dangerous phenomenon before it is too late.

### You can:

- 1. Sign our petition** against political correctness and encourage your friends, family, neighbours and colleagues to sign up too. You can either do this online or ask us for a petition form.
- 2. Become a supporter or member** of the Campaign Against Political Correctness. Please contact us for a form if you do not already have one.
- 3. Put a small advert in the window of your local newsagent/shop/pub/post office** now about the Campaign Against Political Correctness and we will do the rest.
- 4. Let us know about politically correct activity in your area** (even if you can only do so on a confidential basis) enabling us to show others they are not alone in their experiences.
- 5. Write to your local papers/phone your local radio stations** and complain about politically correct activities and stories in your area.

*Most importantly of all, you can object to political correctness whenever you experience it first hand and try to explain why you feel so passionately about the matter. People you know who use politically correct words or actions are not necessarily doing so because they believe it is right – they may just think they have to – and if you explain how divisive and unhelpful political correctness really is, you may find they are actually grateful to you for confirming what they may have already thought themselves but not felt able to express openly.*

## Notes for Window Adverts

We have four small adverts which you can ask your local newsagent, post office, village shop or pub to display. The variations on the different types of advert are as follows:

### Top Left

Leaves a space for you to add your name and contact number as people in your area may prefer to deal with you directly. All that we ask is that you pass on the information you receive so that we can make good use of it. If you do not want this extra work please just select a different advert and ask people to contact the Campaign Against Political Correctness directly.

### Top Right

Provides examples of political correctness and our contact details for more information.

### Bottom Left

Is a simple advert which we hope will catch people's eye with our contact details for more information.

### Bottom Right

Mentions the petition so that the shop, pub etc can display a copy inside for people to sign if they so wish.

**Once you have chosen which advert you would like to use, all you need to do is cut it out and take it (and a petition form if relevant) along to your local newsagent/post office/pub/shop and ask them to display it. If you have to pay a small fee to display the leaflet then the Campaign Against Political Correctness is very grateful to you for this additional support. By doing this you are helping us to spread our message and reach people we would otherwise find it hard to communicate with and, therefore, giving immense support to our Campaign.**
